This year's folk high school weekend will take place on one of the oldest folk high school in the country, Askov, which has been one of the institutions that has shaped the living democracy that we are still striving for today.

At the same time, civil society in Denmark may not be so strong as we usually consider. Knud Vilby has i 2022 authored the book 'Civil society - between state and market' debating the actual influence of civil society that he considers weakened. Knud will present some of his points from his books and speak to the global context that we operate in.

Knud Vilby is a societal commentato through many years, former editor in chief at Information and has been active in several organisations that work globally.

Friday evening will in other words start out with getting a good perspective on both the civil society that we are part of and getting us placed in history. And of course, we will sing a few songs that fits the atmosphere!

Chibeze Ezekiel has been a leading figure in the strong campaign work in Ghana that halted the construction of a coal power plant through a strong mobilization of the affected communities. He has continued to work to ensure a strong recognized role for the youth to be part of the climate change conversations in Ghana.

Junia Anilik is part of the indigenous people's community working as a volunteer with the community-based organisation PACOS Trust in Malaysia, who partners with IWGIA and Operation Dagsværk. She works with addressing the climate change challenges and policies that affect the indigenous community.

Be ready to apply CISU's new Climate Change Adaptation Modality

SATURDAY AFTERNOON (13.00-15.15)

From 2023 onwards you can apply CISUs Climate Change Adaptation Modality - a special support modality that is targetted towards adatation to climate changes

If you experience that your target group increasingly are affected by climate changes such as drought, floodings, crops that don't behave as they usually do or something else, then this new modality is relevant for you to take be alert to.

Focus is on what this new modality can support and how it can be used together with CISUs Climate Integration Tool and the classis methods for project design such as Theory of Change (TOC) and Logical Framework Approach (LFA). There will be examples and exercises around developing outcomes, results and indicators that integrate climate adaptation in your respective projects.
